On Tuesday May 14th, 2019,

Aiming to catalyze regional Mi'kmaw-municipal collaboration on community economic development, the objectives of this Forum were to: **1)** Build relationships between Mi'kmaw and municipal leaders, as neighbors and partners; **2)** Explore community-to-community relationship building and articulate the role that local municipalities and First Nations can play in advancing it; **3)** Identify regional priorities, challenges, and opportunities for First Nation – municipal collaboration on community economic development and discuss solutions; and, **4)** Identify concrete actions for next steps and spend time working on them.

Over seventy-five representatives from across Nova Scotia were in attendance; 30 from Mi'kmaw communities, 31 from municipalities, and 18 from other organizations (businesses, non-profits, federal/provincial government, educational institutions, etc.).
